 - a. Your national ethnic bar association can send in a list of those they support. Be sure to be part of that list.
 - b. Any friends that you have in leadership at the ABA or your local/state bar association.
 - c. The committee/council/commission that you want to join can also advocate for you.

The more people/organizations that you have supporting your nomination, the better your chances. Committee appointments are very competitive for some committees.
