Dear Members of the Asian American Bar Association of Houston:


I wanted to thank you for your recent assistance in finding an attorney to represent an alleged victim in a criminal case that was pending in my court. The alleged victim was a Japanese citizen who did not speak English, and in order to ensure that justice was served, I felt it would be beneficial for the alleged victim to be able to speak to an attorney representing only her interests who was able to communicate with her in her own language.

At the suggestion of my law clerk, Anna Archer, who knew Mr. Yu through the Houston Bar Association ambassador program, we contacted Mr. Yu to request the assistance of Houston's Asian American Bar Association. Mr. Yu immediately emailed your membership to inquire if any of your members would be willing to represent the alleged victim, pro bono. Very soon thereafter, one of your members agreed to take the case. Thanks to the pro bono representation provided by this volunteer and the assistance of Mr. Yu and the Asian American Bar Association of Houston, the alleged victim has been apprised of her rights and her voice has been heard.

I always appreciate it when lawyers are willing to volunteer their time to help individuals who otherwise would not have adequate protection of their rights, and I think this is a prime example of not just one lawyer, but an entire community of lawyers, working together to ensure that this happened. Thank you.
