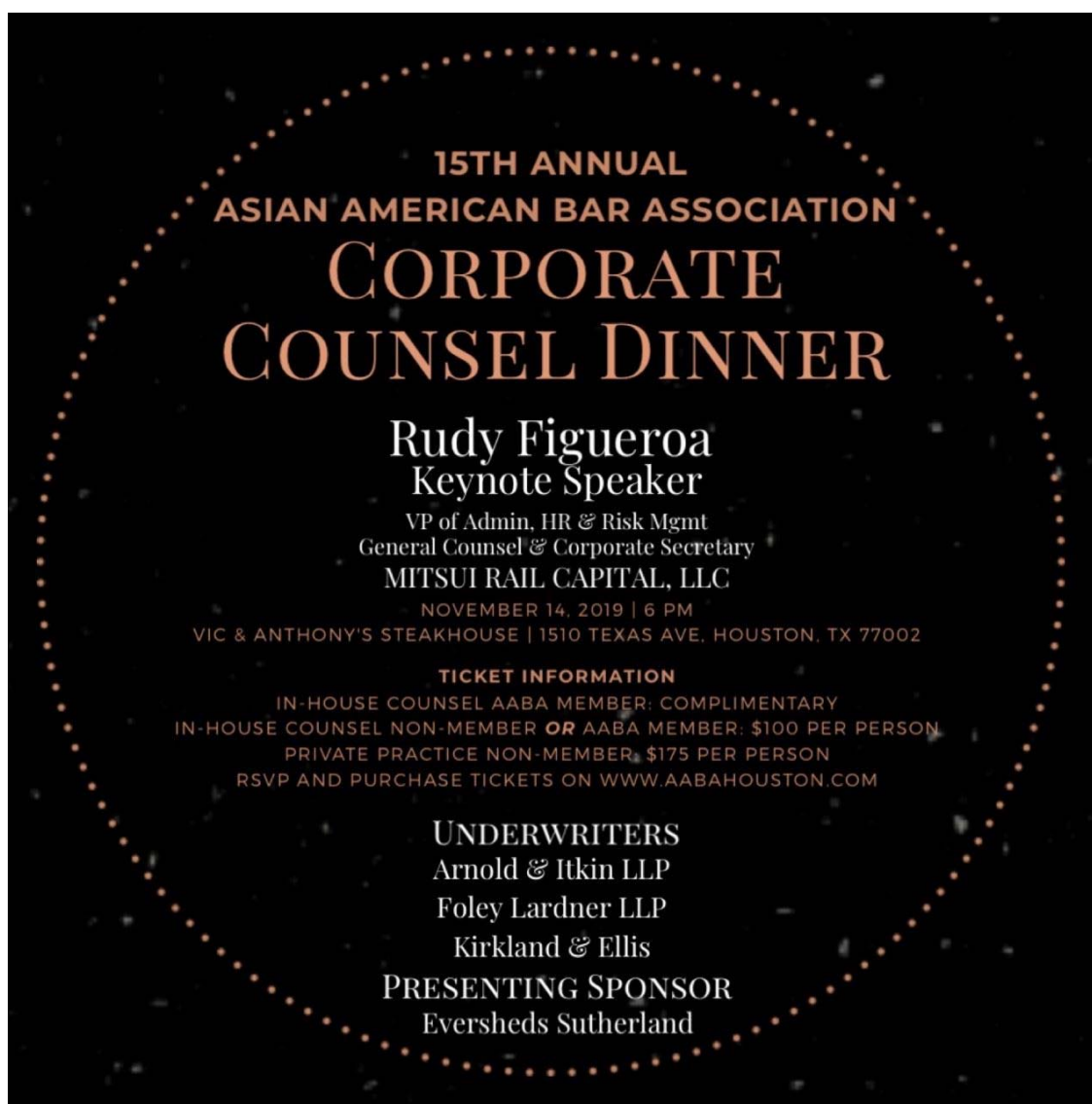

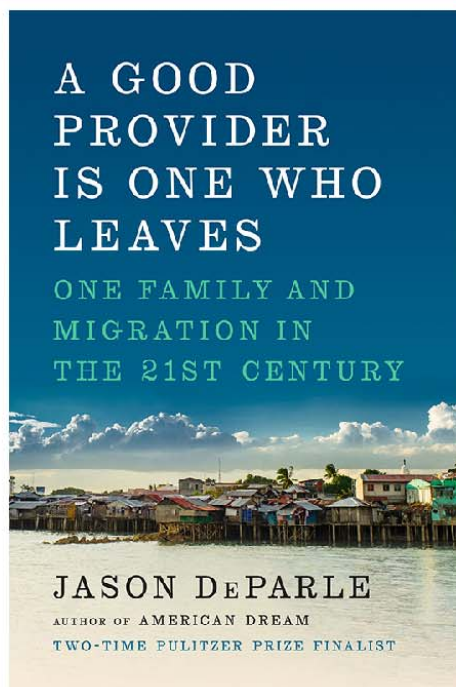

*This introductory level workshop provides insightful presentations on Chinese genealogy research. It instructs attendees on how to use various techniques to advance their own research and discover the interesting information pertaining to their family / clan history and to identify those resources that can best serve them. There will also be exposure to the various information, material, and tools available on the Internet and in books and other sources to assist in compiling and documenting Chinese lineages. The ancestral villages of attendees will be identified and located - the primary source for family genealogy books.*

*This is a "how to" workshop that educates you on what you need to know in order to start performing Chinese genealogical research. The intent of the workshop is to educate people about Chinese genealogy research - so they can start researching and compiling their Chinese genealogy lineage - **without having to be Chinese literate**. Some of the Chinese narratives, lineage annotations, and histories do require translation.*

*Please bring your family genealogy information and lineages and let experienced researchers assist you during the "Hands On Learning & Consultation" roundtable sessions in the afternoons. **Please consider bringing photos of headstones with Chinese characters that often provide the name of the person and ancestral village location.***

*This is a 2-day workshop: **Morning Presentations and Afternoon Roundtables: "Hands On Tutorials & Consultations"** on 4 specific topics. These roundtables are repeated 4 times so an attendee can participate in all the topics covered. **Workshops are conducted from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM each day.***

## **United States District Court Conference on October 29**

The United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas, Houston/Galveston Divisions, will host the District's second Bench/Bar Conference on Tuesday, October 29, 2019, in downtown Houston, near the Federal Courthouse. The day-long Conference will bring together the federal trial judges and federal court practitioners in the Houston and Galveston Divisions. The Conference will focus on how electronic communications, electronically stored information of all kinds, and artificial intelligence impact and can be used in legal practice - to find key material, get the information into evidence, and assist the Court in deciding cases. There will be three plenary sessions of general interest, as well as four civil and four criminal breakout sessions. Ample opportunities are scheduled for attorneys and judges to visit during breakfast, lunch and a post-program social hour included in the Conference.

The Conference is open to attorneys admitted to the bar of the Southern District of Texas or who have pending applications to practice in this District. Remember to check that your S.D. Texas District Court bar admission is current, or make a timely application for admission, if you want to attend. Registration is anticipated to open in September. Further details will be announced as available.

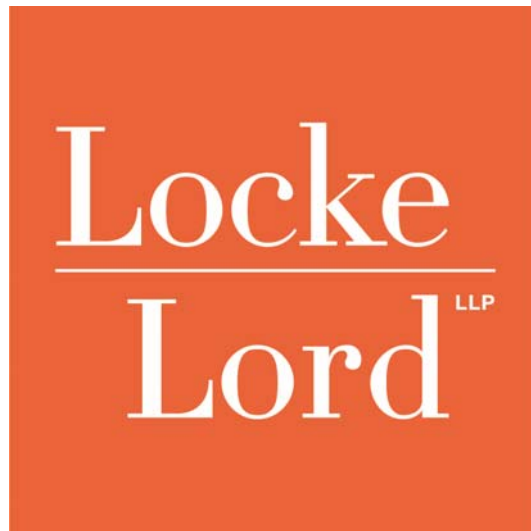
